The mission of the Hart Island Project is to provide visibility and access to New York City's public cemetery including current burial records and maps obtained through New York State Freedom of Information Law. The Hart Island Project maintains a database of public burial records from 1980-present. These burial records are the basis for a storytelling platform called the Traveling Cloud Museum featuring location based software tools for reconnecting people who disappeared in New York City with families and friends across the globe.

The Hart Island Project began in 1991 on the centennial of Jacob Riis's first photographs of potter's field. Visual artist Melinda Hunt and photographer Joel Sternfeld collaborated on a book documenting Hart Island. In 2011, twenty years later, a public charity was then formed to increase

awareness of the burial process within the global community through advocacy and legislation to end penal control of City Cemetery.

In 2019, as a direct result of efforts by The Hart Island Project, the New York City Council transferred jurisdiction of Hart Island from the Department of Corection to the Department of Parks and Recreation.

In 2021, The Hart Island Project launched a campaign to designate Hart Island a National Monument along with a COVID-19 Initiative that includes new tools added to Traveling Cloud Museum for location based storytelling about people buried during the epidemic in New York City. Many were held for months in freezer trucks before burial on Hart Island.
